#### WHAT IS A CARDBOARD BOAT REGATTA?

Participants will be **teams of 2** build a boat and paddles using only cardboard and duct tape. Crews will paddle around a buoy placed in Diamond Lake in front of the Diamond Lake Yacht Club

This year, all vessels will be constructed by teams using a standard cardboard boat kit for a contribution of \$35 per vessels. Either- before the race (kit pick up at DLYC Saturdays 8/13, 8/20 or 8/27 at DLYC parking lot)- OR wait until the day of the race (9/3 at 9:00AM) to pick up your team kit.

## IS THERE A COST? HOW DO I REGISTER?

Boat kits (cardboard, 2 noodles and duct tape) must be acquired for a contribution of \$35 per vessel through the registration link below. Bring your own decorations and box cutters. Registration is OPEN!

## WHERE DO I PICK UP MY KIT AND HOW MANY DO I NEED?

Paid kits can be picked up Saturday morning on 8/13, 8/20 or 8/27 from 9-11 in the Diamond Lake Yacht Club parking lot. A kit will be required for each class registered. We do not expect a vessel to endure two races (i.e., if you register for an adult class and a Senior/Junior class, you will need two kits).

## WHAT IS THE RACE DAY SCHEDULE?

- Boats to be built race day can arrive at 9:00
- Pre-made boats can start arriving at 10:00 am
- Pick up your race number and flag kit at check desk by 10:30
- Set up your boat to be prepared for pre-race inspection by 11:00
- Heats will be posted at 11:15 am
- First race will be 11:30

- Emcee will be on site with music and announcements

## **CONSTRUCTION AND MATERIALS**

- All boats must be with the standard kit.
- Boats can be pre-built. You can "fine tune" at the event site.
- Boat structure must be made ONLY of cardboard and duct tape.
- NO industrial or waxed cardboard is permitted.
- Duct tape with color and pattern print is permitted.
- Please DO NOT use paint in any form. Use colorful duct tape in place of paint.
- You may attach additional decorations with duct tape.
- Decorations should not be used as structural or flotation elements or contain paint.
- Cardboard cannot be sealed with paint or sealants.
- Fastening material is to be duct tape only.
- No wood, plastic, rubber, inflatable devices, Styrofoam, fiberglass, or plastic may be used for boat structure.
- No caulking, two part or mixed adhesives, glues, or epoxy.
- No electrical, gasoline, benzene, propane, or other chemical or electrical propulsion systems.
- Hull wrapping in duct tape is allowed.

- Costumes are encouraged.
- Design is left to the builders. Do not enclose the boat in a way that would impede exiting the vessel when in the water.
- Participants should also construct 2 paddles from cardboard and duct tape. Pool noodles may also be used. These are what will be used to propel you across the pool.
- Boats should be no larger than 60" wide and 84" long.
- Boats should be free of sharp edges, pointy objects, or anything else that could cause injury.

### **PARTICIPATION RULES**

- This event is limited to Diamond Lake residents.
- Every crew member must wear a personal flotation device (PFD).
- Boats will race a total of approximately 200' in front of the DLYC.
- During the competition, crew must be inside the boat. No towing the boat, holding it between legs, swimming, or using the PFD to provide flotation of the vessel is permitted.
- The race must begin and end with the two-person crew intact. Any use of lane lines or sides of the pool for pushing or pulling your boat will result in disqualification.
- Participants arms and legs are to remain inside the boat at all times and should not be used to propel the boats.
- This is a fun event and participants are expected to maintain decorum at all times. Unsportsmanlike behavior is grounds for disqualification.
- Throwing water on another boat is a reason for disqualification except in the event of incidental splash of paddles.
- Event judges have final decision in approval of boat construction, race completion times, and disqualifications.
- Sunken boats must be removed from the facility by participants or discarded in our designated trash receptacle.
- Please do not bring pets to the event.
